Providing Technical Support (Consultant) for the ILO-Child Labour Project “tackling the worst forms of child labour amongst Syrian refugees, internally displaced persons and vulnerable host community members in Iraq.”

- **Projects Background**

Iraq has been affected by conflict, insecurity, and instability for decades. It is currently confronting a difficult fiscal environment because of years of political and social turmoil and the recent collapse in international oil prices. This has all been exacerbated by the COVID-19 pandemic. Around 2 million Iraqis were IDPs who have suffered multiple adverse shocks, including the loss of most of their assets, wealth and jobs or businesses, along with other vulnerable and poor groups of returnees, refugees, and host communities.

- **Introduction and objectives for Technical Support**

The main objective of this consultant is to support ILO team and the partners to integrate Child Labour approaches and Decent Work principles into tackling the worst forms of child labour amongst Syrian refugees, internally displaced persons, and vulnerable host community members in Iraq

The objective of this consultant under this TORs is to provide the technical guidance for the project team to conduct a referral mechanism for the cases for employment of the cases or their relatives for the Employment impact on the cases at the end of implementation.

- **Expected Tasks and Deliverables**

The consultant is expected to conduct the following tasks:

- Conduct the mapping for the data received from the partners to specify the path of employment -referral system.
- Engage and consult with project partners and external partners including UN agencies, as well as ILO technical units, and backstopping specialists in the preparation of project activities.
- (Coordinate with the ILO-Child labour partners in Iraq (Duhok and Nineveh) to implement the required support).
- Provide recommendations for monitoring and reporting on employment-referral.
- Ensure synergies with other ILO projects and programmes, including the Prospects program. (Coordinate with the ILO team and EIIP, Skills and Financial Inclusion Technical Officers in Iraq to implement the required support).
- Coordinate with the UNICEF partners in Duhok and Mosul to implement the required support for the referred cases
- Strengthen relationships to cooperate and coordinate with concerned government authorities, non-governmental organizations (NGOs), target groups, and other key stakeholders in the planning and implementation of activities under the project.
- Coordinate with the public partners (MoLSA KRI (Directorate of Labour, Directorate of Vocational Training in Duohk, and, MoLSA in Mosul, Directorate of Labour and Vocational Training to implement the required support for the referred cases.
- Coordinate with the UNICEF partners in Duhok and Mosul to implement the required support for the referred cases
- Understand the general context of the project and ILO-Child Labour partners within the tackling the worst forms of child labour activities,
- Conduct field trips to Duhok and Mosul to meet the project stakeholders in coordination with the project team and ILO office in Erbil.
- Promote ILO policies, including fundamental principles and rights at work in relation to the project, including in the context of child labour
- Perform other related duties as maybe assigned by the Programme Manager or backstopping specialists.

The Deliverables required from the Technical Specialist are:

- 1- Coordinate and provide support to the team to achieve the creation of the referral path system.
- 2- Monitoring and reporting on employment referral process.

Payment schedule:

2. Second payment: upon submitting monitoring report and referral path system report for June.
3. Third payment: upon submitting monitoring report and referral path system report for July.
4. Payment: upon submitting monitoring report and referral path system report for August.
