## Effect to be given to the recommendations of sectoral meetings

(b) Tripartite Meeting on the Social and Labour Implications of the Increased Use of Advanced Retail Technologies

(Geneva, 18-20 September 2006)

- **1.** The Tripartite Meeting on the Social and Labour Implications of the Increased Use of Advanced Retail Technologies was held in Geneva from 18 to 20 September 2006, chaired by Ms. Perlita B. Velasco, Government member of the Governing Body.
- **2.** The Meeting considered a report <sup>1</sup> prepared by the International Labour Office. It unanimously adopted a set of conclusions.
- **3.** The text, together with a summary of proceedings of the Meeting, appears in the *Note on the proceedings*, which accompanies the present paper. <sup>2</sup> Paragraphs 26-32 of the conclusions concerning future ILO activities call for action by the ILO.
- 4. The Committee on Sectoral and Technical Meetings and Related Issues may wish to recommend that the Governing Body authorize the Director-General to communicate the Note on the proceedings containing the text mentioned in paragraph 3 above:
  - (a) to governments, requesting them to communicate this text to the employers' and workers' organizations concerned;
  - (b) to the international employers' and workers' organizations concerned;
  - (c) to the other international organizations concerned.
