What are work-related welfare facilities?


Work-related welfare facilities are often ignored. Little attention or care is given to toilets, first-aid kits, lunch rooms and lockers. Who cares about them anyway? Workers care. Workers need to drink water, eat meals and snacks. They need to wash their hands, visit the lavatory, rest and recover from fatigue. The essential facilities in your factory show whether or not you care about your workers. If workers are uncomfortable and dissatisfied this can be very costly.

Why improve work-related welfare facilities?

- Poor facilities can spread disease causing fatigue and poor health, which leads to lower productivity.
- Workers appreciate such efforts towards improving workrelated facilities far beyond the time and money invested.
- Workers will be more productive and effective if properly provided with fluid and nutrition to replenish, especially younger workers who have greater energy and water requirements.
- For most types of work, workers will produce much more with rest breaks than they could working continuously.



WISE PROPOSES

Simple methods to improve work-related welfare facilities

- Make sure drinking water and sanitary facilities serve their purpose without spreading disease.
- Be ready for emergencies by having a well-stocked first-aid box and at least one person present at all times of operation who knows what to do in emergencies.
- Make sure that rest means recovery by providing adequate rest breaks and areas.
- Use low-cost facilities to attract and retain the best workers.

Priority

The need for toilets is obvious, even if it tends to be neglected by many enterprises. Your choice is to either make them appropriate or let them become a source of complaints, resentments and difficulties. It is good practice to keep sanitary facilities clean and bright.
